# Te Tiriti o Waitangi | Our Intent

Foundation North recognises that, in taking our early steps on the journey to working in a Te Tiriti based manner, there is work for our organisation that goes beyond our approach to granting. This mahi is both a taonga and a wero – something to treasure and respect, wrapped in challenges and opportunities for growth and learning.

In accordance with our values, and in accepting this responsibility and opportunity, we will:

- reflect, as a whole organisation, on the intent of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, and on how this applies to the needs of Aotearoa New Zealand's diverse society
- work actively to ensure that our commitment is matched in competent practice, through our everyday mahi and at each interaction with us, now and going forward
- proactively develop our meaningful engagement with the Mana Whenua of our rohe; listening to deepen understanding and learning to inform our actions and behaviours
- be responsive to and support communities to increase their readiness and capacity to engage, to strengthen their practices and develop their organisations.

# **Climate Action**

We apply an inter-generational mindset to how we commit our resources, guided by Te Tiriti o Waitangi, including values of kaitiakitanga (guardianship and protection) and kotahitanga (togetherness). We will identify and prioritise opportunities for collective action on climate change, so that we can contribute to greater equity, and community and environmental resilience, health and wellbeing.

With this intent, Foundation North will seek through funding and investments to:

- Accelerate the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions
- Support an equitable and inclusive low-emission society
- Understand and prepare, with communities, for the impact of climate change
- Enhance kaitiakitanga and the resilience of our natural environment
- Create and strengthen opportunities where innovative climate solutions can be realised

We also recognise the need to focus on our own operations and proactively take steps to reduce our carbon footprint.

# **Appointment Process**

Trustees are appointed to the Board for a four-year term by the Minister of Finance. Appointments are administered by the Department of Internal Affairs. Email: appointments@dia.govt.nz

The Minister of Finance appoints Trustees under the Community Trusts Act 1999. The Act states that the maximum term of office for Trustees must not exceed four years, but a Trustee may hold office on more than one occasion. A person must be resident in the region of the Foundation to hold office.

# Skills and attributes required

The make-up of the Foundation Board should reflect the communities we serve, including Tangata Whenua, Pacific communities, people from a diversity of ethnic and cultural backgrounds, ranging in age and with a variety of lived experience.

Trustees are expected to have a broad understanding of the issues and aspirations of the communities of Auckland and Northland. In particular, Foundation North's priority communities include: Tangata Whenua, Pacific peoples, communities of Northland, communities of South Auckland, children and young people, former refugees, new migrants, Rainbow communities, people living with a disability.

# **Officers of Foundation North**

The Trustees annually elect a Chair, Deputy Chair and Committee chairs. Committees include: Investment Committee; Audit, Finance, Risk and Compliance Committee; Appointments, Remuneration and Governance Committee.

# Meetings

- Six Board meetings per year, held on Mondays, usually in central Auckland
- Trustees also take part in sub-committees which convene separately to the Board meeting, usually four times each year
- Two strategy workshops each year, usually held Sunday-Monday in February and in October.
